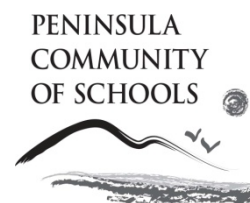

## NO WRAP WEDNESDAY

Just a reminder to all families that every Wednesday is **NO WRAP LUNCH** day at Newport School. **NO WRAP LUNCH** is an initiative to reduce the amount of packaging bought and waste produced. We are educating the students, parents and staff about where our waste ends up and how we can, as individuals, make a difference to the amount of waste we generate. No wrap lunches favour the use of reusable food and drink containers while discouraging the use of pre-packaged foods, plastic bags, juice boxes and the like.

So, for example, if your child likes cheese in their lunch box, cut a chunk of cheese off a large block rather than buy a plastic wrapped cheese stick. Whether the plastic is in your bin at home or here at school, it is still an item in our waste stream that will not ever decompose.

**NO WRAP LUNCH RAFFLE:** every Wednesday, children who bring no wrap lunches to school (grease proof paper is fine) are given a raffle ticket. At the end of each month the raffle is drawn and prizes are given to the winners. Prizes include reusable lunch bags, drink bottles and snack bags and are a reward for considering the environment!

### **2013 Enrolments at NOOSHC for both permanent and casual positions.**

It's coming to that time of the year again - enrolment packages for 2013 will be completed and available in the next few weeks. If your child is currently enrolled at the centre these will be handed out individually. If your child is not currently enrolled and you would like a 2013 Enrolment package for your new kindy (2013) or current NPS student please ring or drop into the centre and leave your details so that you are on the mailing list for same. These will also be mailed out in the next few weeks.

The children have been having great fun cooking up a storm in the ASC session - our Educator Ruby has been assisting the children with measuring, weighing, mixing and eating!!!! chocolate crackles, banana bread and so forth. Lots of learning and discussion evolve around the simple pleasure of cooking - what a fantastic way for children to be involved in learning whilst having fun and enjoyment and then sharing and devouring what they have made.

Parents/guardians are you working, studying, training etc send your child/ren along to NOOSHC - we run a program during the morning and afternoon with a wide and varied range of activities for your child to choose from, have a play with their friends, make new friends. The children rave about the afternoon tea menu - fruit and a varied menu (**pizza, spring rolls with chilli sauce, quiche, nachos, hummus ...**). NOOSHC provides essential, convenient, quality before and after school care on-site, enabling parents / carers to work, undertake study/training or other activities, with the knowledge that their child/ren are being well cared for in a safe, healthy and happy environment. The centre offers before and after school care during the school term. Your child/ren must be enrolled with NOOSHC to use the centre on either a permanent or casual basis.

NOOSHC is run as an Incorporated Association with a Centre Manager - Jo Newton (trained teacher), Assistant Centre Manager - Judy Longworth, as well other experienced permanent and casual staff, a part time book keeper and a parent committee who meet twice a term. The centre offers rebates in the way of CCB (Child Care Benefit) & CCR (Child Care Rebate) to eligible families

### **PARENTS PLEASE NOTE:**

Once again staff would like to remind parents of the importance of notifying the centre if your child is not going to be attending their booked session. It is **EXTREMELY IMPORTANT** (not to mention common courtesy) that you phone the centre and advise a member of staff of absentee (especially for the ASC session). It would be appreciated that you advise NOOSHC of absence ASAP (verbally to staff either in person, via the Parent Communication Book - let staff know you have written in the book - or by phone) and preferably by 2.30pm on the day of booked session, the answering machine is left on at all times (do not send an email as we don't always get to check these and at times the internet may not be connecting etc). Staff check the answering machine when they arrive for their afternoon shift before starting food preparation for the children booked in for the afternoon. If you phone after 3.15pm staff will probably be in the hall setting up for the afternoon awaiting the children's arrival for the ASC session.

This causes exceptional angst for all concerned. If you do receive a message concerning the whereabouts of your child **PLEASE** phone the centre back ASAP to confirm that you have received the message and that your child is actually absent for the session.
