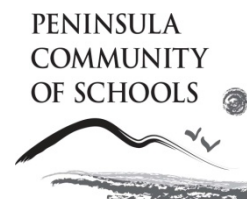

Academic Enrichment News

We are extremely lucky at Newport to have P&C support that provides assistance in classrooms to extend and enrich academically talented students.

Three separate programs have been delivered in Semester 1 based on a range of teaching theories to cater for our wide range of student abilities.

Mrs Parker has been working with a select group of Year 2 students, withdrawing them from their classes on Thursday afternoons. The program concentrates on developing and utilising their critical and creative thinking skills. Using Robert Fisher's thinking games and discussion plans, the children have been taking part in a variety of activities working in groups, pairs and individually. The sessions involve a variety of activities using drama, discussion and writing tasks.

In Term 3, the Year 2 students will continue with the program, concentrating on a variety of critical thinking skills using humour and text.

In 3LS, Miss Shoebridge and Mr Hearne are delivering a program covering Stage 2 HSIE and English outcomes entitled Australia You're Standing in it.

Similarly in 4SC, Mrs Clements and Mrs Keogh are delivering a program covering Stage 2 HSIE and English outcomes entitled Spinning in Space.

Both these differentiated units of work are catering for all learning abilities in the classes with specific focus on high achieving students by:

Giving students choice in the type and amount of research questions they answer; Allowing students to work to their areas of strength and interest; Creating significance by linking the main ideas to picture books and hands-on materials; Providing a range of activities based on Bloom's higher order thinking skills; Asking talented students to produce more (Maker Model-adapting the product); Asking talented students to do some of their own research (Maker Model-adapting the learning process); Using High Press Questioning techniques to extend students' thinking e.g. "If you know this, what else do you know / can you investigate / does it lead to?"; Asking talented students to present their project in the role of a character, from the character's point of view; And using a real audience for students' final presentations.

3LS will conclude their unit later this term with the students presenting their work to invited guests and parents.

4SC will do their presentations for parents in their open-class during education week on Wednesday, Week 3.

Finally, there is an interesting video from an extremely talented 12 year old with some great ideas about encouraging and allowing children to be the best they can be. I especially like her ideas about high expectations.

Lunchbox snack foods

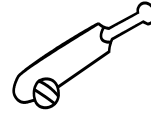
Children need to eat a range of different foods to provide nutrients to meet growth and energy needs. Snacks need to be everyday foods rather than sometimes foods.
