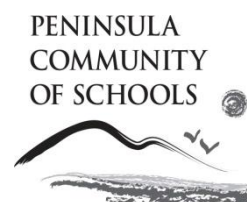

### DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### Parent Information Night

I would like to extend a big thankyou and congratulations to all of our parents and members of staff who made our Parent Information Night such a success. It is well known that effective partnerships between home and school lead to improved educational outcomes for students. This was particularly evident on Thursday night. All classes reported a significant attendance at their individual information sessions and the Early Literacy and Mathletics presentations were also very well attended.

#### Welcome Back BBQ

**Friday 21<sup>st</sup> February, 5.00pm**

Every year our energetic team of Year 6 parents organises the Welcome Back BBQ. It is a great social event that gives parents and staff an opportunity to meet and socialise. We are looking forward to your family joining us this Friday. To ensure everyone's safety and due to the number of families attending it is not possible for children to bring bikes, scooters or skateboards. We would also ask parents to make sure that their children do not bring water bombs to school on the night. They make a difficult mess for our cleaners to have to collect.

#### 1CC Demountable

On Tuesday, I received notification that we have been assigned our new demountable building. The expected completion date for the installation is 3-4 weeks. This week, temporary fences will be erected and work should commence on the foundations. Of course, this time frame is weather dependent. We will endeavour to keep you informed of the progress of the building delivery as we receive information.

#### Head Lice

Around this time of year, when the weather is warm and humid, head lice become very prevalent. We ask that all students who have long hair (girls and boys) make sure it is neatly tied back at all times. If your child does experience head lice, please treat their hair before sending them to school.

#### Communication Channels

From time to time parents may need to approach the school in order to:

- discuss the progress or welfare of own child
- express concern about actions of other students
- enquire about school policy or practice

It is therefore necessary to have procedures that will help solve problems as soon as possible so that a safe and harmonious school environment is maintained. On occasion, concerns may cause frustration and anxiety. At such times it is always important to organise a time to talk with school staff in an unhurried and confidential atmosphere. The best results usually flow from working together.

Where the concern involves the academic progress of your child or any social concerns the first point of contact should be your child's teacher. If you have questions regarding school policy or practice, please direct your enquiry to the school office.

#### Dogs at School

I would like to remind parents that dogs are not allowed on the school grounds. This is a standard policy of the Department of Education and Communities and is set in place for the safety of all children. Please refrain from bringing your dog onto the school grounds, or tying them up to the school fence. We would hate for any child to be bitten by someone else's pet.

## Peninsula Community of Schools (PCS) Extension Class Test 2014

The PCS Year 7 Extension Class Test 2014 will take place on March 11. Each local PCS High School runs an extension class stream. To be considered for placement in these classes in 2015 students must complete the Extension Class Test. An information package and applications for the test are available from the front office. Applications are due to Narrabeen Sports High School by February 28.

## School Uniform

We have got off to a great start this year, with the majority of our students wearing the correct school uniform. Our Uniform Policy is attached to this week's Natter. I would ask that parents read this and please ensure that your child is correctly dressed. When not in sport uniform children should wear proper leather school shoes, not joggers or canvas shoes. We would also ask that children not wear skate shoes or canvas shoes for PE or sport. Children's feet need to be properly supported during these activity times. The Uniform Policy has been endorsed by the P&C Association, who support all children wearing the correct uniform.

## SCHOOLS CLEAN UP DAY –Friday February 28

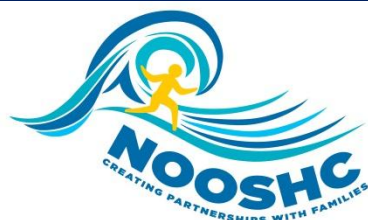

## NEWPORT PUBLIC SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

The uniform policy at Newport Public School, endorsed by the P&C, states that all children be correctly attired at all times.

To clarify this, the following Guidelines have been formulated by the Student Welfare Committee.

Correct uniform includes any attire which is available to **all** Newport students and may be purchased at the Newport PS Uniform Shop.

**Specialist uniform items, e.g. football socks, softball pants, sailing jumpers and band shirts etc should only be worn while directly participating in these activities.**

### SUMMER UNIFORM:

#### Girls

Check uniform  
Check culottes with white Newport polo shirt  
White socks  
Black shoes  
Hooded Fleecy Jacket

#### Boys

Grey cotton shorts – to be worn above the knee  
Grey cotton trousers  
Light blue shirt  
Grey socks/Newport socks  
Black shoes  
Hooded Fleecy Jacket

**This uniform is to be worn during Terms 1 and 4 and only in the above combinations.**

### WINTER UNIFORM:

#### Girls

Winter tunic with light blue blouse / skivvy  
Tartan pants with light blue blouse / skivvy  
White socks or navy tights  
Black shoes  
Hooded Fleecy Jacket

#### Boys

Grey cotton shorts – to be worn above the knee  
Grey cotton trousers  
Light blue shirt/skivvy  
Grey socks  
Black shoes  
Hooded Fleecy Jacket

**This uniform is to be worn during Terms 2 and 3 and only in the above combinations.**

### SPORTS UNIFORM:

#### Girls

Newport knit shorts / Newport track pants  
White Newport polo shirt  
White socks  
White Joggers / runners  
Hooded Fleecy Jacket

#### Boys

Newport knit shorts/Newport track pants  
White Newport polo shirt  
White socks (may be anklets)  
White joggers/runners  
Hooded Fleecy Jackets

To be worn on PE days and Friday Sport days (Primary only) and only in the above combinations.

### HAT OPTIONS

Newport school cap Years 3-6  
Newport broad brimmed hat Kindergarten – Year 2

**Newport School has a “no hat no play” policy.**

### OTHERS

Headwear - scrunchies, hair bands or bows made from school uniform material  
royal blue, gold or white ribbons

### JEWELLERY

Acceptable items include - watches, stud earrings.

No large or coloured items e.g. necklaces, shell jewellery, dangling earrings, bracelets etc., should be worn to school.

NB. Those uniform pieces which are being phased out and are not listed above may still be worn.

NB. Coloured or black shirts / skins etc. **should not** be worn under the uniform so that they can be seen.

NB. Scarves and gloves are not part of the uniform. They may be worn to and from school e.g. on the ferry.

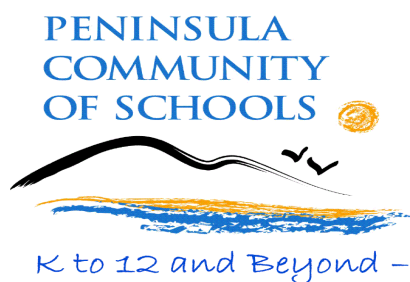
