Dear Parents,

Wednesday concluded our Kindergarten Orientation program with more treasure hunts, reading, writing and maths in classrooms. All our teachers reported an enthusiastic group of 2017 Kindergarten students who we're really looking forward to have 'officially' join us next year. I would like to thank the office staff, Kindergarten and Year 5 teams, Jo Moore, Cathy Holden, Julie Parker, Ellie Pretty, Sarah Jewell, Marianne Gutherson, Emily Jefferys, Jane Logan, Lisa Body, Verity Holland and Ashleigh Gorjup for organising the program.

We are currently in the planning process for 2017, looking at our forecast for student numbers to calculate the class breakdown for each grade. As this is the case, we're asking everyone to communicate with the office if there will be changes affecting the placement of your children at school as soon as possible.

Thank you to everyone who participated in our positive message/crazy sock mufti day last Thursday. The school was a sea of colour and the children made the effort to be 'extra' positive. The money raised from the day will help the Year 6 fundraising committee to pay for their gift to the school.



School Parliament engaged in a very productive meeting last week. It was a pleasure to see Year 3 attend and have such a positive input into the meeting. The ministers continued to express ideas that will improve not only our school environment, but the greater Newport area. The ministers have communicated with Tammy in the canteen, negotiating the use of reusable plastic cups for slushies. If children bring a reusable cup from home, the canteen will fill it with 200ml of slushy, cutting down on the single use plastic that we currently use. Ideas of keeping our playground clean and improving the sport captains' voting process were also discussed. Archie G. and Jayke J. have written a detailed report, included later in the Natter.

Finally, last week was Teacher Recognition week. I spent some time in the playground asking students, "What do you love about your teacher?" The comments I received highlighted the positive impact our teachers have on the lives of our students. Parliament Report

Thank you Year 3 who attended this Parliament. In this meeting we discussed the Year 6 gift to the school, changing the house captain voting system, mufti day, art as an RFF subject and picking rubbish up during lunch time for five minutes.

The Year 6 gift to the school is a mural that will go on the blue wall outside 3JB. The ministers and a group of Kindergarten students talked and drew pictures with an artist named Meg Minkley to give her an idea of what to paint on the wall. Meg drew two samples that could be used. Everyone at Parliament was extremely pleased to see students' ideas combined into interesting drawings that will decorate our school.

In this Parliament meeting the ministers put forth two motions. The first motion was about changing the sport house captain voting system. The Sport and Leisure ministers said that the teachers should vote as well as students so it is not just about who has the most sport patches on their uniform or who is more popular. This motion was unanimous and passed easily. Mr Hearne will discuss these changes with the teachers before this year's voting.

The second motion presented by the Grounds and Environment ministers was about having five minutes to pick up rubbish from the playground during lunch time. This would make our school environment cleaner. This motion was defeated and the majority of comments from Parliament suggested that we should all be responsible for our own rubbish and pick up any rubbish that we see as it is the right thing to do.

The Charity and Fundraising ministers talked about the positive themed mufti day which was held on Thursday 27 October. The money raised will go to the Year 6 gift to the school (the mural). Thank you to everyone for your participation in this initiative that started in Parliament.

To keep our school environment healthy, students can bring in their own plastic cups to use when they buy a slushy from the canteen. Instead of buying single use plastic cups, we can use plastic cups from home, wash them and re-use them next time. This would mean our school wouldn't produce as much plastic rubbish.

After the motion of having art as a RFF subject was carried last term, the Welbeing ministers passed this idea on to Mrs Deratz, Mr Hearne and Mrs Baldi. Mrs Deratz, Mr Hearne and Mrs Baldi will consider this idea as they plan classes and subjects for 2017.

The Parliament award went to Holly Bracey for her great comment about keeping our environment clean.
