Thankyou to Mr Cox and the Year 3 team for organising this excursion which supplements the Year 3 Science and Technology unit - Earth and Space and to the parents who accompanied the students on the excursion.

Congratulations to the members of the Chess team who represented Newport at the Primary Schools' One Day Northern Beaches Chess Tournament last Thursday at Mona Vale School.

There they pursued the goals of thinking deeply about Mathematics and thinking like a mathematician to problem solve in a variety of activities. 

Sunsmart at Newport

Ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun can cause sunburn, skin damage, eye damage and skin cancer. Childhood and adolescence are critical periods during which exposure to UV radiation is more likely to contribute to skin cancer in later life

From the beginning of August until the end of May, the UV index levels are 3 and above. During these months particular care should be taken to protect yourself and your child from overexposure to the sun.

The following symbols from the Cancer Council remind all of us to:



Protect yourself in five ways from skin cancer

At Newport School we have a "No Hat, No Play" policy. The staff at Newport enforce this policy to help protect your child from the harmful effects of UV radiation. You can help you child by reminding them to wear their broad brimmed hat to and from school each day and during sport, recess and lunch.

What is ultraviolet (UV) radiation?

UV radiation comes from the sun, but unlike sunlight, it can't be seen or felt. It comes directly from the sun and can also be scattered in the air and reflected by surfaces such as buildings, concrete, glass, sand, snow and water. UV radiation can pass through light cloud and can be damaging to skin on cool, cloudy days as well as on hot, sunny days.

There are three types of UV radiation:

- UVA: transmits freely through the earth's atmosphere.
- UVB: about 15% of UVB transmits through to the earth's atmosphere. The rest is absorbed by ozone.
- UVC: is absorbed by ozone and does not reach the earth's surface.

UVA and UVB both contribute to sunburn, skin ageing, eye damage and skin cancer. Your risk of developing skin cancer is related to the amount of UV radiation you are exposed to over your lifetime, particularly in childhood.

So please remember to:

Election of School Leaders

SCHOOL CAPTAINS

Nominations and voting take place during Week 7, Term 4

- Names are taken of any Year 5 boys and Year 5 girls who will be at Newport Public School next year and would like to nominate for School Captains/Vice Captains.
- Names of absent students are included.
- Year 5 students vote on the nominees.
- Nominees with the highest number of votes (approximately 8-10 candidates) are included on a ballot paper.
- These candidates prepare a 1 minute speech at school (to ensure fairness, candidates will be given the specific topic at school and time to prepare their speeches. Speeches are not to be prepared at home).
- 6. All Year 5 students and all teachers vote for 2 boys and 2 girls.
- The boy and girl candidates with the highest number of votes are elected Captains. The boy
 and girl candidates with the second highest number of votes are elected Vice Captains.

HOUSE CAPTAINS

Nominations and voting will take place in Week 8, Term 4.

- 1. Voting for House Captains is completed after the School and Vice Captains are elected.
- All Year 5 students wishing to nominate for House Captain will complete the nomination slip and return it to their class teacher.
- 3. All teachers vote on the student nominees. The candidates are decided by this vote.
- 4. Voting is then done at House Meetings. All those in attendance (Years 2-6) have a vote.
- The candidates will introduce themselves and say why they believe they would make an excellent House Captain.
- 6. Students will vote using the heads down arm up voting method.
- 7. The candidate with the highest number of votes is announced as the House Captain.
- Voting process is then repeated. The candidate with the highest number of votes from the remaining candidates is the Vice Captain.
- 9. The process is conducted for both boy and girl candidates.

MUSIC CAPTAINS

Nominations and voting will take place in Week 9, Term 4

- Any Year 5 Band/Orchestra member, who has not been previously elected, can nominate as Music Captain.
- 2. Candidates are selected in consultation with the Music Program conductors.
- Candidates are presented to the music ensembles. They will introduce themselves and say why they believe they would make an excellent Music Captain.
- 4. Members of the Music Program vote using the heads down arm up voting method.
- 5. The two candidates with the highest number of votes become Music Captains.

During the two days we were able to practise these skills in activities like dome building, tessellation activities, Fibonacci sequences, and petals around the rose.


Below, we have included a problem we had to work on during our lessons. We would like to challenge you to think like a mathematician and complete the problem, collecting data to show as many patterns as you can.
