Many thanks to our fabulous fundraising team and their band of merry helpers, for a very successful Christmas stall last week and for accommodating the Year 6 students on the Friday, as part of a very busy Term 4 calendar.

Last week the Year 5 Leadership Program came to an end. I had the pleasure of listening to 10 well planned and mature speeches about the role of a formal student leaders at Newport and what would be involved in successfully fulfilling these responsibilities. Common themes included showing initiative, listening, being positive and setting a good example for others. Congratulations to the Year 5 cohort and their teachers, for such a meaningful leadership program. Our formal 2017 student leaders are announced at Presentation Assembly.

This coming Wednesday is Year 4 Market Day and as you are aware, the event meets two specific purposes – the first, to support the teaching/learning program across Year 4, the second, is to encourage the students in being "other person centred" and working to raise money for the Happy Village School in Cambodia. Earlier this year, Mike Pawley visited Newport School with some students who had been supported by



the Happy Village charity. The students told us about life in their area of Cambodia and how, although they had little in the way of material possessions, they were very happy.

They thanked us for our assistance in helping them attend school (which they saw as a true privilege) and we in turn, talked about how they have helped us with a learning opportunity for a real-world purpose and audience. Market Day serves the teaching/learning purpose as part of Science, English and Creative Arts. The students recognise a need/ market for their product, design it and notice short falls and redesign. They need to cost the raw materials, persuade their parents to buy these, then the students make their product (learning what works and what doesn't). They need to advertise their product through posters and persuasive texts and price their products (so consider what the market will tolerate). Then they have to sell their product thereby interacting with others. Additionally, the students are also mindful of where the proceeds go and for whom and for what purpose. On sale on Wednesday, will be simple, fun merchandise, made with love by 10 year olds, for a very meaningful cause.

It is important to remember, at this time of the year especially, that on a general day to day basis, the students are asked not to share food at school, as sharing could cause a friend with allergies, to become very sick or create a life threatening emergency, for a child with anaphylaxis. This includes edible treats that often accompany Christmas cards during the coming festive month. Additionally, when students are on excursions including our school picnic celebrations in a few weeks' time, both the school and the Department of Education have a very strict 'no food sharing' policy. There are many other ways to enjoy our picnic days and your support in reinforcing this message with your child is important for keeping all of our students safe.

As you know, our planning is well underway for 2017. Currently, we are working to accommodate our student numbers across Years 3 to 6, in the most effective format of classes and as stated last week, are on the cusp of being able to form 32 or 33 classes. Traditionally, we have experienced a small number of students moving to other schools for the start of Year 5. If your family is in this position, please let us know as soon as possible so we can be accurate and prepared with our planning for next year.

Every term, I get updates from the Office of the Children's E-Safety Commissioner. #### **Blaise Pascal**

In the Week 6 Natter we left you with the Mouse Problem also known as Pascal's triangle. Here is the information and solution we promised.

In Mathematics, Pascal's triangle is a triangular array of numbers that when complete show a multitude of interesting patterns and number tricks. It is named after French mathematician Blaise Pascal.

Blaise Pascal was a French physicist, inventor, writer and Christian philosopher as well as a mathematician. He was a child prodigy who was educated by his father. Pascal was an important mathematician, helping create two major areas of research: 1. He wrote a thesis on the subject of projective geometry at the age of 16;

2. He later corresponded with Pierre de Fermat on probability theory, strongly influencing the development of modern economics and social science.

In 2016, 150 children participated in the Newport Public School Music Program. It covers seven ensembles with the starting points being Violin 1s (K-Y2 children), Training Band (Y3/4) and The String Orchestra (Y3).

Violin 1s - most children commence in Year 1, although can start in Kindy or Year 2. There are two rehearsals a week before school. Violins can be hired from the Music Program.

Training Band - for children starting a wind or percussion instrument. There is one practice a week before school and instruments can be hired.

String Orchestra - children either continue violin or take up another string instrument. Two practices a week and instruments can be hired.




#### Musica Viva - Taikoz


The performance is part of the school's music program and builds on preparatory work done in the classroom.
