## **Principal's Report**

As I write this, we have a little over three weeks of school left for the year. Despite the Christmas break approaching there have been no signs of students or teachers 'slowing-up' with much learning taking place and many exciting activities planned for the coming weeks.

Teachers have been analysing student assessment results and preparing the Semester 2 reports. When reading your child's report, the statements under each heading tell you what a child in that particular grade should be able to do at this point in time. If your child is achieving a sound (or 'working at' for Kindergarten), he or she is able to complete the task or demonstrate the knowledge or skill at their grade level. If your child is achieving limited or basic for the statement, he/she hasn't demonstrated proficiency in this yet. If your child is achieving a high or outstanding for the statement, he/she is demonstrating greater ability in this particular area of knowledge/skill or understanding.

This semester we will email reports to families. Printed reports will only be available on request from the school office. Reports will be sent to your primary email address as indicated on your child's enrolment form and only one report will be sent per family. If you have extenuating circumstances and need multiple reports emailed, or you need to update your email details, you will need to make changes by emailing Newport-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au or via the school office by Friday 7 December. Reports will be emailed on Thursday 13 December.

Teachers have also been upskilling themselves in how to identify personality types by studying the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator (MBTI) at a recent professional learning afternoon.
